PET EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE:

- This department is open to youth, 5yrs - 18yrs.
- Qualifying animals should be primarily kept as pets and cannot be exhibited in any other department.
- Tortoise and Hare Race participants ok.
- Do not enter animals raised for meat or fur.
- Animals *protected* by the Game and Fish Department *will not be accepted.* (gila monsters, horny toads, etc.)
- Animals that are *illegal* in Arizona *will not be accepted.* (alligators, hedge hogs, piranhas, walking catfish, etc.)
- Animals must be housed in suitable containers - *escape proof!*
- Exhibitor is responsible for maintaining food and water.
