Some exhibits could be entered in either division, such as posters of meat cuts or anatomy. Decide how to enter based on when the exhibit was made. Was it made during a project meeting as a process of learning or was it made for the Fair to demonstrate learning. Exhibits should be easy to display. Demonstration posters are accepted. Exhibits done by 2 or more members are allowed. Please enter individually but indicate other participants on entry form.
