Exhibits should demonstrate:

1. Preservation or re-establishment of clean air, water and wildlife habitat areas for human enjoyment, education and recreation. Example: nature trails
2. Efficient use of renewable and non-renewable resources: water - space - soil - energy - minerals.
3. Develop alternative forms of energy for living and working space. Development of raw materials that replace non-renewable resources.
4. Create a complete program involving gun and hunter safety.

Exhibit ideas: Posters (posters are part of the display) - before and after photos, static and mobile displays - simple devices or machinery - use small animals or plants as illustrative material.

Exhibits cannot be more than 4' wide plus height of wall space. Free standing exhibits, that require table space, cannot exceed 1/2" deep x 4 ft. wide x 4 ft. high. Floor exhibits can be 6' in height. For larger exhibits, contact Superintendent prior to entering. If distinctly different, exhibitor may enter more than one display.
